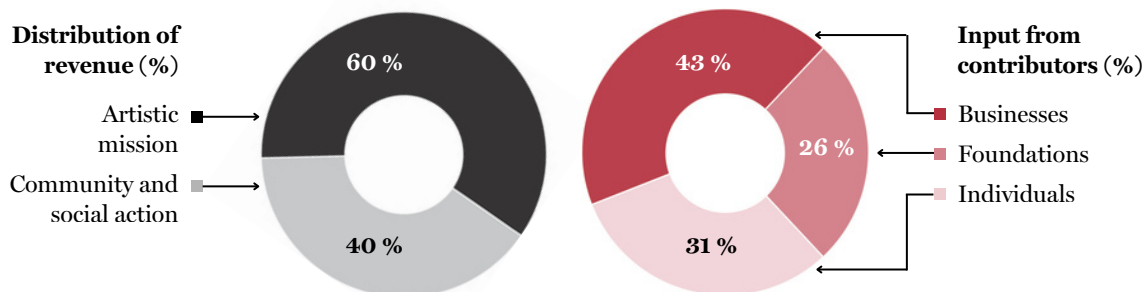

DONATION CAMPAIGNS

THE NUTCRACKER FUND FOR CHILDREN

Fall 2025

The campaign to benefit The Nutcracker Fund mobilized numerous donors in support of access to culture and for the continuity of this iconic Les Grands Ballets production. Contributions were also generated through various complementary channels, including major donations, donations via ticket sales, concert hall collections, merchandise, commercial agreements and revenue from the online auction.

STEP INTO THE DANCE!

Spring 2026

Inspired by Ivan Cavallari’s ballet *The Lake*, this campaign brought to light the tangible impact that donations to the Creation Fund made on the creation of new works for the company’s repertoire. The journey from a work’s initial idea to its final performance can take several months, if not years. This feat of creation harnesses the talents of over a hundred artists and artisans.

POINTE BY POINTE, FROM THE STUDIO TO THE STAGE

Ongoing until 2027

The first joint campaign by Les Grands Ballets and the École supérieure de ballet du Québec (ESBQ), this initiative is headed by Les Grands Ballets dancer and ESBQ graduate Tatiana Lerebours, and ESBQ student Maxime Coulombe. Its objective is to fund the 400 pairs of pointe shoes for students dancing in the École’s annual show and in certain Grands Ballets productions, notably *The Nutcracker*.

SNOW WHITE & THE MIRROR

Reinventing narratives

This creation pushed the boundaries of the classic fairy tale through a contemporary approach that integrated set design, video projection and artificial intelligence. This kind of project illustrates the importance of your support for exploring new narrative forms.

THE CREATION

A dialogue between music, dance and the visual arts

- Choreography: Uwe Scholz

This program illuminated the multitudes and inseparability of music and dance. Carried by the orchestra and choir of Les Grands Ballets, and three vocal soloists, our dancers gave a living embodiment of Joseph Haydn's eponymous masterpiece, in Uwe Scholz's choreographic tableaux.

Your support made possible these large-scale productions uniting dance, music and the visual arts, notably this Québécois version of the ballet enhanced by projections of paintings by Jean-Paul Riopelle.

It nourished spaces for experimentation, for a development of new practices and a transmission of knowledge among artists, contributing to the vitality and continuity of creation.



THE BLUE HOUR

Supporting contemporary creation

This project illustrated the effect of your support on the development of contemporary creation. Your support enabled Principal Dancer Vanessa Garcia-Ribala Montoya to revive an existing work and Anne Plamondon to create a new piece. These two presentations contributed to revitalizing choreographic composition and to showcasing female artists.



THE LAKE

Reinterpreting great classics

- Choreography: Ivan Cavallari

To close the season, Ivan Cavallari revisited a masterpiece of the classical repertoire, giving it a contemporary and cinematic interpretation.

This production required over 300 costumes that were designed by Maria Porro and crafted in Les Grands Ballets' workshop. It also called for 75 performers on stage, 30 of whom were students from the École supérieure de ballet du Québec, a point of encounter between professional creation and emerging artists.

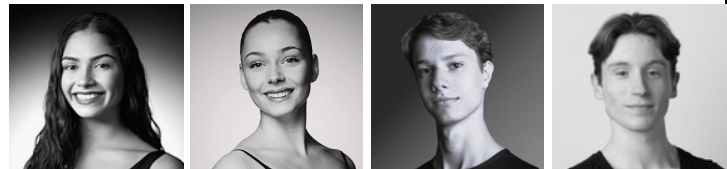
DANCE APPRENTICES

Entering the profession

Les Grands Ballets welcomed four apprentices, including two graduates of the École supérieure de ballet du Québec and one of Canada's National Ballet School: Ana Sofia Natera Marquez, Laure Billeau, Simon Adamson-De Luca and Arran O'Sullivan. This program gives up-and-coming dancers their first paid professional experience. Hired on a full-time basis, apprentices follow the same schedule as our permanent dancers and gain vital experience before joining a professional company.

CHOREOGRAPHIC WORKSHOPS

Experimenting and creating

Held at Les Grands Ballets' Studio-Theatre in March 2026, the Choreographic Workshops provided dancers with a framework for research through which to shift from the role of performer to that of choreographer.

This in-house laboratory, made possible thanks to your support, helped 10 dancers to create short works performed for an audience. It fostered experimentation, risk taking, and the emergence of new choreographic voices within the company.

MASTER CLASSES AND EXCHANGES WITH ARTISTS

Transmitting knowledge and inspiring emerging artists

This season, six master classes were given by the company's dancers to close to 140 students from four Quebec dance schools: the École supérieure de ballet du Québec, the École de danse de Québec and Danse Attitudes, both in Quebec City, and the École de danse L'Entre-Choc in Victoriaville.

These exchanges enabled young dancers to deepen their technical training. Some activities also took the form of discussions and question-and-answer sessions, cultivating privileged dialogue between the next generation and the company's dancers, and allowing students to learn more about the realities of the profession, about artistic career paths, and about the stage experience.

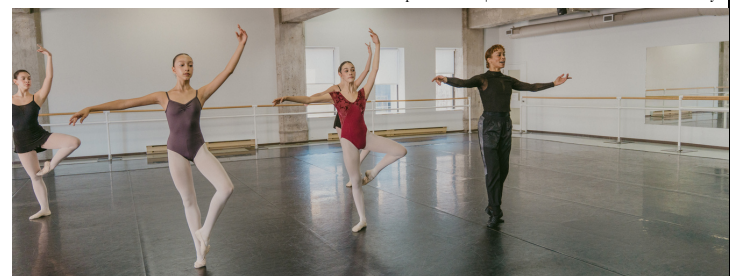

BRINGING THE NUTCRACKER TO LIFE, YEAR AFTER YEAR

Your commitment helped Les Grands Ballets to offer, again this year, a sprawling production and unique cultural experiences to thousands of spectators of all ages.

MOBILIZATION AROUND THE NUTCRACKER FUND FOR CHILDREN

581 individual donors

55 contributors to the auction

36 foundations and corporate partners

Ensuring the show's continuity

Donations to The Nutcracker Fund contributed directly to supporting a large-scale artistic production fuelled by the work of hundreds of artisans, technical personnel and dancers.

Maintaining and restoring sets and costumes for the show is also essential work that guarantees continuity of what is the longest-running Canadian ballet on the same stage, performed for over 60 years at Place des Arts.

Access to the show free of charge for 2800 children

This season again, the free Nutcracker matinee with orchestra was given at Place des Arts, along with a greeting and photo session with the dancers.

Half the children were with community organizations and pediatric health facilities and were guests thanks to partners and donors, while the other half were with elementary schools located in underserved areas enrolled in the ministerial program *A Montreal School for All*.

ENRICHING THE ARTISTIC EXPERIENCE

More than the show, your support of The Nutcracker Fund helps to enrich this artistic experience through workshops, encounters and special initiatives for children and families.

Workshops for a sensitive encounter with the arts

Thanks to your generosity and to a partnership with *À Montréal School for All*, dance, visual arts and play-reading workshops were offered to elementary school students in the greater Montreal area that show a higher deprivation index, letting them experience a sensitive and immersive encounter with the arts.

Your support also enabled the company's dancers to visit several pediatric facilities and reach out to children who are unable to move about. These moments of sharing provided an artistic interlude filled with presence, listening, and comfort.

Immersive experiences for children and their families

Through the program *Mouse for a Day*, your donations of \$1,000 gave young people an unforgettable experience: the opportunity to be on stage for the very first time. During Act I of *The Nutcracker*, they became Les Grands Ballets dancers, performing the iconic role of a little mouse

This magical moment continued in the concert hall, where children joined their families for the rest of the show, for an experience both artistic and meaningfully shared.

With the selection method revised to include a wider reach of children, this initiative let even more young people experience this unique immersion at the heart of creation.

Your support also enabled us to sponsor and accommodate families for each performance of *The Nutcracker* at Place des Arts, and to offer an accessible and inclusive cultural experience.

THE NATIONAL CENTRE FOR DANCE THERAPY

For over 13 years, Les Grands Ballets' National Centre for Dance Therapy (NCDT) has remained at the heart of the company's social mission, putting dance in the service of wellness, inclusion and the health of communities.

With your support, the NCDT's activities have developed and expanded, making it possible for us to forge new partnerships with organizations, to train more dance therapists, to broaden our services and to advance knowledge on dance therapy.

An approach in the service of wellness

The National Centre for Dance Therapy is dedicated to promoting the benefits of dance and its accessibility to various communities, particularly vulnerable or marginalized groups. It aims to strengthen the role of dance and the arts as tools for prevention and well-being.

Its activities are based on two complementary approaches:

- **Adapted Dance** is a recreational dance practice tailored to accommodate participants with particular needs, for example, people with autism or Down syndrome.
- **Dance Therapy** uses movement to facilitate self-expression and address individual emotional, cognitive, physical and social health.

Thanks to your support, these activities are run in a caring and inclusive setting, with concrete results on the wellness of participants and their families.

ACCESSIBILITY AND TRAINING

Your support of the National Centre for Dance Therapy does not stop at action with people in their communities: it also helps to support training of the next generation of dance therapists and to make the practice of dance more accessible.

A Relaxed Performance

A showing adapted for every need

Thanks to your support, in June 2026, participants from partnering organizations were able to experience a relaxed performance of the ballet *The Lake*, at the Salle Wilfrid-Pelletier.

This initiative makes dance more accessible to people who might otherwise be excluded from traditional performance venues. The experience is adapted to reduce sensory barriers and encourage everyone's participation: adjusted lighting and sound levels, retreat areas accessible at all times, as well as freedom of movement and interaction within the space.

Beyond the above adaptations, this experience creates a true space for encountering dance, where every participant can encounter dance in their own way, unhindered.

The Alternate Route

Training emerging artists in dance therapy

Your support also contributes directly to training the younger generation in dance therapy, through the program *The Alternate Route*.

This intensive course, spread over three concentrated summer semesters, represents the only program in Canada that offers recognized courses for certification with the American Dance Therapy Association.

Through this program, future professionals develop a practice rooted in intervention, listening and assistance for diverse clientele, thereby strengthening the quality and scope of dance therapy services.

The 5th cohort's first year was in July 2025 and was held in Les Grands Ballets' studios. This phase brought together 21 students dedicated to their training program.

BALLET TO SHARE

Thanks to your generosity, the *Ballet to Share* initiative lets people who would not otherwise have access to the performing arts experience a ballet performance in a welcoming and inclusive setting.

For people living in isolation or who experience economic precariousness or vulnerability, these outings are far more than entertainment: they are a breath of fresh air, a space of respite and a cherished occasion to gather for an artistic experience filled with emotion and beauty.

Your support also helps to enrich this first encounter with dance through cultural mediation activities. Before the performance, participants receive an introductory booklet on ballet and get a chance to talk with dancers and members of the artistic team, to learn about the phases of creating a show and what goes on behind the scenes.

Among the participants were students from arts programs at CEGEPs in the Montreal area, seniors, refugees, families in vulnerable circumstances, youth from youth centres, people living with Alzheimer's and caregivers.

By making these experiences accessible, you are making a tangible contribution to reducing inequalities in access to culture, and to making dance a true vehicle for well-being, discovery and social connection.

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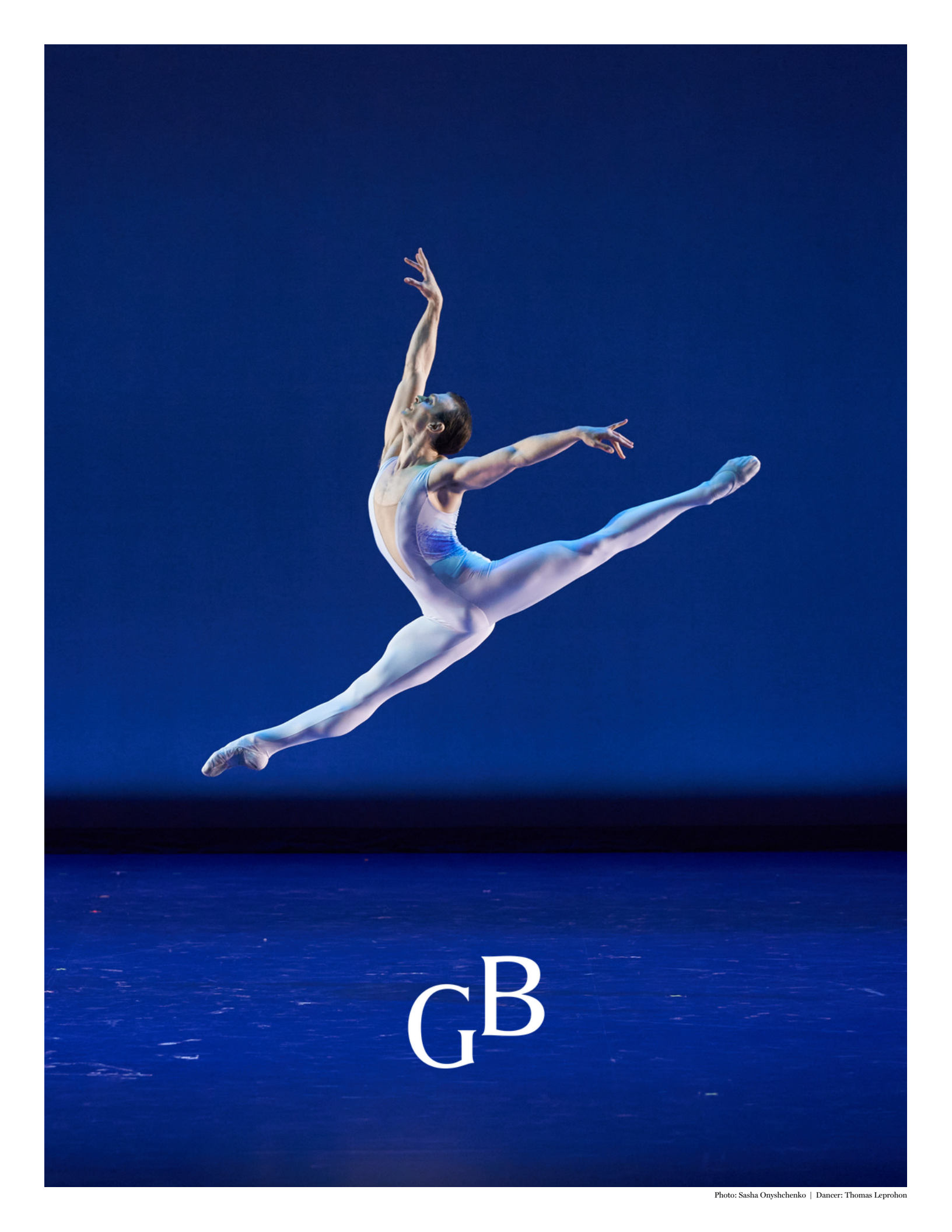
