THE SLEEPING BEAUTY

Sleeping Beauty by Prima Ballerina Assoluta Marcia Haydée to hit Les Grands Ballets' stage!

Montreal, May 3, 2022 – An absolute masterpiece of the classical repertoire, *Sleeping Beauty* returns for the first time in 40 years to Les Grands Ballets' stage, in a version by famous prima ballerina assoluta, <u>Marcia</u> <u>Haydée</u>. The sleeping princess and her court will awaken from their centennial sleep to the notes of Tchaikovsky's score, from June 1 to 5, 2022, at Salle Wilfrid-Pelletier.

A living legend in the world of dance, Marcia Haydée, whose career as a dancer, choreographer and artistic director spans over almost 7 decades, will be in Montreal for the premiere of her celebrated ballet. Created initially for the Stuttgart Ballet, an institution that has marked her career, Haydée bases herself off of the original version of the piece by Marius Petipa and preserves the essence of this classical ballet from the 19th century. However, her version gives a more predominent place to the role of the evil fairy Carabosse than Petipa's original creation. Under Haydée, Carabosse becomes a central and nuanced figure. It is also one of the rare times where this classically feminine role is interpreted by a male dancer!

The story of the slumbering princess goes back several centuries and went through numerous versions before Perrault was inspired by an Italian tale to write what would become the *Sleeping Beauty* that we know today. On the day of her christening, an infant princess receives a curse from the fairy Carabosse, whom no one invited to the fete; the fairy wishes for Aurora to prick her finger and die on the day of her 16th birthday. Fortunately, another fairy succeeds in easing the princess' plight by having her fall instead into a deep sleep of 100 years. Only true love's kiss will awaken her. 'It is for me a dream come true to bring *Sleeping Beauty*, one of the greatest ballet of the classic repertoire, on our stage, particularly in this version by Marcia Haydée. Firstly, because this legendary figure of dance has taught me enormously during the years I had the chance to work with her at Stuttgart Ballet. But also, and mostly, because her version of *Sleeping Beauty* is deeply humane. This ballet brings you a sense of beauty and emotions that inhabit you long after you leave the theater.'
