Les Grands Ballets' 2023-2024 season is unveiled!

Montreal, March 13, 2023 - Les Grands Ballets is happy to unveil its 2023-2024 season, the company's 67th at Place des Arts. For its 7th year at the helm of artistic direction, Ivan Cavallari invites the audience to experience emotional journeys through dance.

Early September 2023, *Cinderella* by Jayne Smeulders will be back on the stage of Wilfrid-Pelletier for additional performances. Thanks to this addition of three shows, more spectators will enjoy this ballet en pointes, faithful to the tradition of fairytales.

In October, Peter Quanz is invited by Ivan Cavallari to present his creation *La Dame aux camélias* inspired by the masterpiece of Alexandre Dumas fils. In this Neoclassical ballet, he explores emotional vulnerability, inspired by the fragile and ephemeral beauty of camellias. The costumes and set design evoke the glamour and elegance of Parisian salons while an exclusive orchestral score features compositions by female composers from different epochs.

Contemporary dance will shine in the mixed bill **Cantata**: the love of choreographers for their art will offer a show at turns visceral and passionate, sensible and dreamy. The choregraphic duo Jérémy Galdeano et Věra Kvarčáková as well as Étienne Delorme, dancer in the company, will present new creations. The bill will be completed by the inflamed work of Bridget Breiner, *In Honour Of*.

In *Carmina Burana*, Edward Clug will revisit the powerful legacy of Carl Orff's music. His choreography centres on human beings in their most visceral dimension: legacy and longevity.

A wonderful end of season will bring *Giselle*, a jewel from the classical repertory choreographed by Ivan Cavallari after Marius Petipa.

Cinderella

Let the centuries-old magic of the *Cinderella* fairy tale transport you back to childhood. Between her cruel stepmother and vain, selfish stepsisters, Cinderella doesn't have it easy. That is, until her magical fairy godmother appears and changes the course of her life forever.

This is Jayne Smeulders' first full-length ballet, which she choreographed when she was still a principal dancer with the West Australian Ballet in 2011. She chose this classic piece from the repertory, taking inspiration from Brothers Grimm fairy tales, set to the famous 1944 score by Prokofiev. Smeulders places *Cinderella* in a timeless and fantastical world for Les Grands Ballets, made all the more captivating with new sets and sparkling costumes. This sublime ballet en pointe is a delight for the whole family.

Their story is told in love letters, passionate embraces, and ultimately, loss and scorn— ideal material for a romantic ballet!

Through this two-act Neoclassical ballet, Peter Quanz explores emotional vulnerability, inspired by the fragile and ephemeral beauty of camellias. The costumes and set design evoke the glamour and elegance of Parisian salons, while an exclusive orchestral score features compositions by female composers from different epochs.

Created in 1964 by Québec choreographer Fernand Nault, this timeless classic has won the hearts of generations of audiences with its skillful blend of fantasy, magic and humour. With dazzling sets, sumptuous costumes and a dreamlike vision of childhood, this ballet features some 100 dancers. A fabulous adventure for the young and the not-so-young!

Cantata

Mixed bill From March 14 to 16, 2024 Théâtre Maisonneuve – Place des Arts

With its visceral, passionate gestural language, *Cantata* evokes rugged Mediterranean beauty and embraces the colours of the South. Instinctive and vital, the dance explores the multiple facets of relationships between men and women, from seduction and passion to quarrels and jealousy. The voices and music of the four on-stage singers of Gruppo Musicale Assurd draw the ten pairs of dancers into the festive working-class atmosphere of Southern Italy, to the sounds of the tambourine and castanets.

This mixed program also features works by up-and-coming choreographers. Company dancer Étienne Delorme presents a dynamic contemporary ballet with tension and sensitivity. Bridget Breiner will address the challenges of the creative process, between devotion and inspiration with *In Honour Of*, a dazzling dance. Jérémy Galdeano and Věra Kvarčáková explore themes of impermanence and reverie in their piece *Nebe* ("sky" or "heaven" in Czech).

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Carmina Burana

Double bill From April 13 to 20, 2024 Salle Wilfrid-Pelletier – Place des Arts With Les Grands Ballets Orchestra, choir and soloists

Romania's Edward Clug revisits *Carmina Burana*, the major 20th century work by German composer Carl Orff. Inspired by medieval verse, the piece opens with its famous theme *O Fortuna*. *Carmina Burana* centres on human beings in their most visceral dimension: legacy and longevity. Clug's vivid staging brings to life a wheel of fortune that captivates the dancers. It evokes both the cyclical nature of life and the idea of predestiny. Alongside its implicit theme of torment, Carmina Burana also explores the themes of springtime, hope and love as told in medieval writing.

Jeunehomme by Uwe Scholz will complete this double bill. On the notes of Mozart's concerto, the belated German choreographer pays homage to the beauty as well as the melancholy of the great composer's works.

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Giselle

Giselle, often described by critics as the ballet par excellence, has never ceased to inspire choreographers and dancers since its creation at the Paris Opera in 1841. Giselle, an innocent peasant girl, is seduced by Duke Albrecht, who, unbeknownst to her, is betrothed to another. Albrecht's deception creates a mental crack in Giselle, who gradually sinks into madness.

This gem of the classic repertory is faithful to the grand Romantic tradition with its gestural symbolism, pointes and white tutus. With its powerful theme of undying love that transcends madness and death, this ballet pits myth against reality with a result that is both captivating and powerful. An evening of eternal beauty that you won't soon forget!
