

Les Grands Ballets launches its Fall cultural season

Montréal, August 22, 2022 – Les Grands Ballets is launching its 65th season and creation takes once again the central stage for Ivan Cavallari's 6th year at the helm of the Les Grands Ballets' artistic direction.

For the first time in 15 years, the company will perform two free shows at Théâtre de Verdure in parc La Fontaine, on August 24 and 25, 2022, in the *Rendez-vous d'été* series. Then, dancers and musicians will make their comeback at Salle Wilfrid-Pelletier in Place des Arts with *The Four Seasons* double bill.

Presented from September 22 to 24 with Les Grands Ballets Orchestra led by Dina Gilbert with Julie Triquet as Solo Violin, this program pairs Mauro Bigonzetti's ballet on the famous musical notes by Vivaldi and *Symphony No.* 7 by Uwe Scholz on Beethoven's music. With these luminous pieces, the choreographers dare the impossible and take up the enormous challenge of expressing something new through these famous classical pieces. A double masterpiece!

From October 20 to 23, Étienne Béchard will present the world premiere of his new creation *Carmen*, set on *Carmen Suite* by Rodion Shchedrin. His "3.0" version will carry this symbol of rebelliousness into a virtual universe with no holds barred and explore the effects of new technology and entertainment on our behaviors. This triple bill will also showcase Les Grands Ballets' dancer and choreographer Kiara Flavin through her new piece *The Waves* on Stravinsky's violin concerto. Finally, *The Rite of Spring* by Béchard first created in 2017 for Les Grands Ballets will close this explosive evening.

In November, the company will have the pleasure **to tour Quebec** with a mixed program of recent creations by figures of the new generation of choreographers and works from the repertoire. In Quebec City, Stabat MATER will complete the evening program. The tour will visit Gaspé, Rimouski, Baie-Comeau et Québec.

A fall season that brings promises of light, audacity and energy!
